Location: 90 minutes from Cairns; 2 hours from Port Douglas; 2 hours from Mission Beach

The Property: 93 hectares of rainforest bordering Wooroonooran National Park; traditional indigenous Mullunburra country

Accommodation: 3 x studio (1 king bed - sleeps 2), 4 x two bedroom treehouses (1 king & 2 singles- sleeps 4), 2 x two bedroom treehouses (2 kings & 2 singles - sleeps 6)- all privately set in the rainforest

Treehouse amenities: Full kitchen facilities, spa bath, shower, laundry (washing machine, dryer), fireplace, covered carport, TV, DVD player, barbecue, private balcony, fans, linen, games, triple sheeting, spring water in taps, bathrobes
